AccessAbility Services Audio Recording Agreement

Under Section 504, Subpart E Postsecondary Education, of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act, institutions of higher education may not deny a student with a documented disability equal access to the institution's programs, courses, and activities, when reasonable accommodations are approved by AccessAbility Services. The ability to audio record lectures and/or discussions may be deemed as a reasonable accommodation for students who provide the proper documentation that substantiates their need.

- I shall not publish, or otherwise quote, dialogue from lectures without the written consent of the lecturer.
- I shall not allow anyone to listen to, access, or use the recordings and/or transcriptions, except for the WCSU Office of AccessAbility Services, upon request.
- Instructors are allowed to direct you to turn off recording during the presentation of sensitive material (instructors will maintain confidentiality, when asking students to turn off recorder).
- Instructors will allow you to transcribe the recorded lectures themselves or allow a transcriber who is (1) provided by the WCSU Office of AccessAbility Services and (2) who is not a WCSU student to transcribe the recorded lecture.

After the conclusion of the semester, and not to exceed 48 hours following the final exam, I agree to destroy all copies of the recordings and/or transcriptions. I understand that a violation of this agreement may subject me to disciplinary action under the Student Code of Conduct or subject me to liability under copyright laws.
