



Sources of free ebooks/audiobooks for summer reading

<p>DHS Media Center Catalog offers access to some ebooks. A YouTube video tutorial on how to use the DHS catalog is available here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=E_2hUn9U0y0</p> <p><i>Look for this symbol next to a book in our catalog to be sure it is an ebook.</i></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Go to DHS web site 2. Click “Media Center” link at top middle of page 3. Click blue button that says “Library Catalog” 4. Type the subject or title of the books you are looking for in the search bar 5. If you see the small blue & white “e” symbol next to the book, it is an e-book 6. Click the title to read the book 7. Some e-books are free access and will open right up; others require login 8. Your login information is: Username = your login name tcat4265 Password = your state ID # 1017602391

Once you get a Danbury Public Library Card, ask the librarian to help you with OneClick digital for ebooks. 2. Directions for OneClick digital are in the box below this.



<p>OneClickdigital contains more than 1 million audio and ebooks available through iconn.org. Allows users to electronically “check out” books for limited time periods. http://iconnct.oneclickdigital.com/#</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Download the “OneClickdigital” app from your app store. <i>(This allows you to read/listen to files you download on your device.)</i> 2. Go to the link at left and create a free user account. 3. Search the book you want. 4. Select audio or ebook version.

Go to link at left & search the title you want. 2. Choose title, and read online OR download to your Dropbox, Google Drive, or MS Cloud account. 3. Make sure you have the entire version of the book.

<p>LibriVox offers free public domain audiobooks read by volunteers. https://librivox.org/</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Go to link at left & search by author, title, subject, etc. 2. Multiple versions of your book may show up--make sure you select the version with the entire book. 3. Listen online or download using green buttons on left side of screen.
<p>iconn.org, the CT state library, offers millions of free downloadable ebooks in a variety of formats for various devices. http://www.cslib.org/iconnsitemap/staff/FreeEbooks.a</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Go to link at left and select from a LARGE variety of links for ebooks. 2. Search and select the book you want. 3. Listen online or download in a file

<p>Open Culture provides free educational media, including ebooks, audio books that can be read/listened to online, or downloaded in a variety of formats to personal devices. <u>http://www.openculture.com/free_ebooks</u></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Go to link at left and select audiobook or ebook.2. Search by title/author, etc.3. Select the title and type of file you want, or just read/listen online.
