This form is to be completed by a faculty or staff person who becomes aware of an act of interpersonal violence that has taken place, whether from a direct report from a student, a staff member or a third party. Even if the person making the report tells you that the crime has been reported to a police department, it is important that this form be completed and filed with the WCSU Police Department, who must track this data for reporting purposes. Interpersonal violence includes sexual assault including rape, sexual harassment, stalking and intimate partner violence.

**Sex Offenses:** Sex offenses are of a special concern to the campus community because they have been historically under reported. The victim of a sex offense typically desires confidentiality and anonymity; as a result he/she will often seek a reporting source other than law enforcement. Because the sex offender may continue to pose a threat to the community, the threat potential needs to be evaluated and the campus community alerted/warned as necessary.

<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Intimate Partner Violence</b>	<p>Intimate partner violence is a pattern of coercive, controlling behavior that can include physical abuse, emotional or psychological abuse, sexual abuse or financial abuse. It is a pervasive, life-threatening crime that affects thousands of individuals in Connecticut regardless of age, gender, economic status, race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or education. Victims are left feeling scared, confused, dependent and insecure about their ability to “survive on their own”, financially or otherwise.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Rape</b>	<p>Unwanted sexual intercourse with forced penetration that includes vaginal, anal or oral penetration by a body part, object or ejaculate. Force may involve psychological coercion as well as physical violence. Rape can occur with a stranger or non stranger. Rape can happen to anyone, Male, female, children, elderly, straight or gay individuals.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Sexual Assault</b>	<p>Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person’s will; or not forcibly or against the person’s will where the victim is incapable of giving consent. Sexual assault includes rape, child molestation, incest, exposure and unwanted touch.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Statutory Rape</b>	<p>Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent. The age of consent in Connecticut is 16.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Interpersonal Violence</b>	<p>In Connecticut, it is illegal for someone to physically assault, stalk or threaten you even if that person is a member of your family or household, or is someone you have dated. Connecticut defines family or household member to include any of the following persons regardless of their age: Spouse or former spouse, Parents or their children, Persons related by blood or marriage, Persons living together other than those married or related, Persons who have children in common, Persons who are currently in or who have recently been in a dating relationship.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Stalking</b>	<p>Stalking is when a person “knowingly” engages in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for such person’s physical safety or the physical safety of a third person. A course of conduct means two or more acts in which a person directly or indirectly uses any action, method, device or means to follow, lie in wait, monitor, observe, survey, threaten, harass, communicate with, or send unwanted gifts or interfere with a person’s personal property. When submission to such conduct is made wither explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual’s employment or academic status. Submission or rejection of such advances is used as the basis for employment or academic decisions affecting such individual. This conduct also affects the individuals work or academic performance by creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working or academic environment.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Sexual Harassment</b>	<p>Any unwanted sexual advance or request for sexual favors or any conduct of a sexual nature when submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual’s employment. Submission or rejection of such advances is used as the basis for employment decisions affecting such individual. This conduct also affects the individuals work or academic performance by creating a intimidating, hostile or offensive working or academic environment.</p>
