- **Build critical leadership competencies**, including ethical decision-making, teambuilding, problem-solving, and financial management.

Through leadership shadowing, guided projects, and mentorship, you'll gain hands-on exposure to leadership in action while building a foundation of adaptability, accountability, and resilience.

YOUR LEADERSHIP JOURNEY

HSLP offers a **high-impact field experience** in either the fall or spring semester. You'll:

- Shadow top leaders in fields like business, education, law enforcement, finance, media, healthcare, and more.
- Work on meaningful projects tied to your academic major or career goals.

- Learn the strategies leaders use to navigate challenges, inspire teams, and drive organizational success.
- Showcase your growth in a final public forum alongside other student leaders.

- **3 credits** of Cooperative Education Internship (CED 297) for successful completion of the program.

ELIGIBILITY

To join this transformative program, you must:

- Be a full-time WCSU undergraduate.
- Have **leadership experience** or a strong desire to develop as a leader.
- Hold a 3.0 GPA or higher and have earned 45–100 credits.
- Be available for a **fall or spring semester shadowing experience**.
- Submit all required materials by Friday, May 2, 2025 to manented@wcsu.edu.

Through HSLP, you will:

- Develop a clear understanding of leadership philosophies and your own leadership style.
- Learn practical strategies for:
 - Motivating and managing diverse teams.
 - Navigating conflicts and making effective decisions.
 - Providing feedback and fostering growth in others.
 - Balancing innovation with ethical responsibility.
 - Cultivate resilience and adaptability in the face of challenges.

LEADERSHIP FIELD EXPERIENCES

Your field placement will align with your academic and career aspirations.

Examples include:

- Shadowing a corporate executive, town official, educator, law enforcement officer, or community activist.
- Gaining insight into leadership within non-profit organizations, corporations, educational institutions, and more.
- Observing decision-making, delegation, and organizational dynamics firsthand.

You'll dedicate **150 hours**, averaging **6–8 hours per week** over 14–15 weeks, to shadowing, reflection, and optional project work.

OPTIONAL LEADERSHIP PROJECTS

HSLP participants may also engage in optional projects that allow for deeper involvement, such as:

- Designing and conducting surveys.
- Assisting with fundraisers or outreach campaigns.
- Supporting new initiatives or school programs.
- Collecting and analyzing data to drive decisions.

Projects are tailored to meet the needs of the host organization and enhance your learning.
